Category 1: Safe and Caring - is your school a welcoming place?

- Supporting that all students are cared for by one another as unique gifts from God
- Christian service and charity projects Terry Fox Run, Food Bank, Gifts for Grandparents, Kindness Crusaders, Lenten project Doors of Mercy
- Increased supervision at lunch hour to allow for one supervisor in each class

- New Curriculum implementation in grades 5 and 6
- Leadership opportunities for students including Kindness Crusaders, Leadership program, Ment To Matter leadership

- Mental Health and Wellness presentations for ALL students by community agencies and counsellors
- Authentic Learning experiences in exploratory classes and all subject areas (hands on, community related)
- Academic assistance offered through Educational Assistants, LIFT Team and Counselling Team
- Monies donated by Parent Council to provide experiences in our community faith activities, musicals, school-based presentations and activities
- Use of educational technology in ALL classrooms

- Our Exploratory courses in grades 6 and 7 have been modified to allow students to experience 12 different career and technology courses to expose students to possible careers and courses in high school
- Our school-wide focus on Spirituality shows that each student is different and has different God-given gifts to improve the world around them
- Mock interviews and career learning opportunities for Grade 9 students
- Intentional career connections are made through authentic and hands-on classroom learning experiences.
- Grade 9 students attend Discovery Day the high schools to experience High School options there

• Focus on developing a sense of Catholic Citizenship at school, community, local and global levels by building connections

- Student celebrations have shifted a focus to our Crusader Award recognising students who model the attributes of Mother Teresa
