# Principal's Report

#### **Celebrations:**

Celebration of Excellence - May 21<sup>st</sup> - 3 retirees (Joanne Michaud, Dick Huizing, Anne Dyck) and 2 years of May 2021 service - Jeremey Ziebart (15 years) and Shane Chisholm (20 years)

# Faith:

- Catholic Education Week daily prayers focussed on 5 marks of Catholic education and a shared liturgy online
- May is the month of Mary Mr. Locke shared various resources and activities for classes

#### **Information Items:**

- Currently 421 students with 20 enrolled in At Home Learning Intention for 2021 2022 went out in February, and we are projecting 425 students with an approximate enrollment of 10-15 students in At Home Learning.
- High School recommendations are completed with final transition meetings between schools to be completed
- Division Budget and School budgets are finalized
- Teacher Evaluations completed
- Class lists and parent requests are now being worked on for next school year
- Grade 4 to Grade 5 transition parent presentation May 18<sup>th</sup> Google Meet

- Schollie Survey results key points -
  - In 11 measures in the Schollie Survey, our parents rated us 100% in 8 measures and 93% in 3 measures.
  - We have some growth areas when it comes to Grade 7 students as they rated us 54% when asked if they learn about God in all of their classes. Other Grade 7 data shows that, 'I believe that God created me' was scored at 86% and our 'Catholic faith teaches me a good way to live' was scored at 83%. Between these 3 key questions statements we had between a 6-12% drop. There continues to be a trending disconnect with our Middle School students, for the third year in a row.
- EMTS is up for Technology refresh teacher desktops/office desktops will be updated including 200 Chromebooks.

#### 1. Mental Health and Wellness

- The Board of Trustees received a presentation about "Mental Health and Wellness On the Frontlines" where they were given a first-hand account of mental health issues, priorities and innovative ways our Division counsellors and principals are addressing mental health-related matters within our school communities.
- Mental Wellness Day for Schools Alberta Education has announced that June 3, 2021 will be a day that will focus on mental wellness in schools. # 3. RDCRS Opts Out of Piloting New Draft Kindergarten - Grade 6 Curriculum this Fall:

- The Board of Trustees reviewed the draft curriculum feedback information presented by the Superintendent.
- The Superintendent explained that the Division held seven days of feedback sessions with teachers to give them an opportunity to provide input about the draft curriculum.
- This feedback, along with a comprehensive review of the draft curriculum from the Division level, will be sent to Alberta Education to help guide revisions and recommendations moving forward related to the curriculum.
- The Board of Trustees decided that Red Deer Catholic Regional Schools will be opting out of piloting the new Draft Kindergarten Grade 6 Curriculum this fall.

• The Board of Trustees directed the Board Chair to share the preliminary report and write a letter to the Minister of Education, outlining the decisions made by the Board and to advocate for a delay to the curriculum's implementation and the withdrawal of the social studies curriculum.

#### 4. Catholic Education Week:
