- As we continue with the warm weather, please ensure our dress code is being adhered to.
 All students at École Mother Teresa School, both grade 5 and middle school, are expected to dress modestly and in a manner that reflects that we are learning in a Catholic School.
 Clothing is to be modest and respectful of a Catholic school. The following guidelines apply:
 - Clothing should have limited midriff showing and clothing & accessories should have no slogans that are deemed inappropriate for a Catholic school.
 - Caps, hats, and hoods are not allowed in school or at school functions.
 Caps/hats/hoods should be removed once inside the building.
 - Shirts or tops should have a modest neckline and the back is not to be exposed.
 Spaghetti straps are not permitted.
 - Shorts and skirts, there are no "short shorts" or mini skirts. The majority of the thigh and the full bottom needs to be covered.
 - Students should not have any undergarments visible at any time; top or bottom.
 - Students that do not comply with this dress code will be asked to change or call their parents to bring appropriate clothing.

<u>École Mother Teresa School</u> <u>Grade 6/7 and 8/9 Exploratory Courses</u>

Dear Grades 6-9 Parents/Guardians;

Welcome back and we hope you have had a restful summer. In Grades 6-9, students have the opportunity to engage in Exploratory Courses based on career and life skills. These courses are designed to develop abilities that students can apply in their daily lives when preparing for entry into the workplace or for further learning opportunities.

For the 2023-2024 school year, our middle school team has shifted the 6/7 exploratory courses and 8/9 exploratory B courses to run in 6 week cycles, allowing for skill development in a variety of areas. Several factors have led to this decision including teacher feedback, timetabling and the intentions of exploratory courses at the Middle School level.

Students in grade 6 and 7 will have the opportunity to engage in ALL of the options available. In grade 8/9, students will choose their 12 week option A, but will engage in all of the options available in section B. Below are the courses offered in grades 6/7 and 8/9.

Dear Parents,

We are writing to you today to remind you and your child about the expectations for student cell phones at school. As you are already aware, Ecole Mother Teresa school has had an established "no cell phone" policy during the academic portions of the day for the past few years. As a teaching community, we feel that the distractions that cell phones play in an optimal learning experience is significant and the decision to eliminate them was not made lightly.

Therefore we are asking for your support in reminding your child that the only times they can have their cell phones out is before school, at lunchtime or after school. We will continue to have the expectation that all students should have their cell phones in their locked lockers rather than on them, during teaching and learning time. Teachers have all agreed to use other electronic devices other than cell phones to support academic learning during class time. Grade 5 students will continue with a no phone policy at all times during the day.

We will continue the conversations with our Middle School students about the policy during the coming days and weeks. However, from this point forward, any student who accesses their cell phones outside of the designated times, will be required to hand in their phone to the office. On their first and second offense, students will have to retrieve their phone at the office at the end of the day. Should there be a third offense, a phone call will be made to a parent and the cell phone will remain at the office until a parent is able to retrieve it. As stated previously, students are still able to use their phones prior to school, at lunch, and after school. We would appreciate it, should the need arise, that you contact our school office as urgent messages will be accepted and relayed by the office staff during break times.

As always, we make every effort to create an optimal learning environment which is conducive to teaching and eliminating distractions for teachers and students alike. We thank you in advance for your support and for reiterating the importance of following these expectations with your child when you can.
